

Every unit owner is eligible to serve on Council Committees.


Standing Committees consist of Budget and Finance, Architectural, Long-Range Planning, Bylaws, and Grounds. Ad hoc committees are formed when deemed necessary.

All committee members and committee chairpersons are appointed by the President of the Community Council with the advice of the other elected Council Officers. Appointments are made among those unit owners who have expressed interest in the subject matter of the Committee and have the appropriate background and experience relevant to the committee's interests. Each committee acts on behalf of the residents at the direction of the Board of Directors. Each Committee will consist of several members. Each committee shall meet as often as the chair deems necessary and shall make regular reports of its meetings to the Board of Directors.

The appropriate committees consider issues facing the Council. It is not unusual for individual committees to be involved with other committees, and it may be beneficial for committees to collaborate and work together on certain issues. For example, physical design considerations normally fall to the Architectural Committee. Changes in revenue expectations or cost of operations that may be involved would typically be of concern to the Budget and Finance Committee. The Long-Range Planning Committee establishes

a plan for replacement or improvements for Common Element Improvements. The mission of the Grounds Committee is to recommend the maintenance and improvement of the grounds on Common Elements. These tasks include landscaping ideas, irrigation, and aesthetic quality and beauty of our grounds. Because of this interplay, it is incumbent on the Chairpersons of each committee to be

our gratitude for their service to our country.

energy, expertise, and talents. Their support of Wynmoor allows us to continue


to fulfill our mission in our community.


First of all, what is the Webster dictionary's definition of honor?

If You Now Have Equity In Your Home, Consider Doing A Trust!

In 2012, I wrote an article recommending against doing a Revocable Living Trust if you were "underwater" with your mortgage. I wrote that article before the housing market in South Florida began to recover.

The last five years have seen significant increases in property values. This has resulted in many homeowners now having positive equity. In the third quarter of 2015, 322,701 homeowners in Palm Beach, Broward and Dade counties owed at least 1/4 more than the market value. However, according to a recent article in the Sun Sentinel, most homeowners now have equity in their home.

In the article I wrote in 2012, I advised clients to live long enough to see their properties increase in value to exceed the amount of the mortgage; at that time, they could come back to me to discuss a Revocable Living Trust. That time is now here.

Without equity in your home, it does not make sense to pay an attorney the fee and costs involved in creating a Trust, since you would be burdening your heirs with a property that has a negative equity. However, once that equity turns positive, you are doing your heirs a favor by eliminating the time and money involved in going through probate. Remember also that the Trust is called a "Revocable Living Trust." This means that, as long as you are alive, the Trust remains with you. You can always sell your home



and buy a new home as Trustee of your Trust. You do not need to change the Trust unless you want to change the beneficiaries for the new property. You can also buy additional properties, in Florida or out of state, as Trustee of your Trust.

Therefore, if you now have equity in your home, you should seriously consider creating a Trust. Transferring your home to the Trust will not change your homestead or your real estate taxes.

In addition, regardless of the equity in your home,

it is extremely important to have current advance care directives to protect you if you are incapacitated. These include the Durable Power of Attorney (which must specifically include the address of your property) as well as the Designation of Health Care Surrogate and Living Will. New Florida laws could mean that your current documents need to be revised.

Determination, Deliberateness, Design or Default Our lives can be based on and created by the

above.

This article is both a continuation of last months on Thoughts and Beliefs and a very short synopsis of a chapter in my book, The Pursuit of

Happiness. It is the first article in a while that is not a reprint or edited version of a previous one.

We can live our lives by the first 3Ds or by the fourth. We can let things unfold or create them the way we want them to be or even through a combination of purpose and default.

Can we decide to be happy, peaceful, and content just because we think we should be and want to be? Do most people even believe they should be happy? Do they believe it is their birthright? 



How is your retirement taxed?

Once you're retired, you will likely need to draw on several types of income for your living expenses. You'll need to know where these funds are coming from and how much you can count on, but you should also be aware of how this money is taxed — because this knowledge can help you plan and budget for your retirement years.

Here's the basic tax information on some key sources of retirement income:

- Social Security Many people don't realize they may have to pay taxes on their Social Security benefits. Whether your benefits will be taxed depends on how much other taxable income you receive from various sources, such as self-employment, stock dividends and interest payments. You'll want to check with your tax advisor to determine whether your income reaches the threshold where your Social Security benefits will be taxed. The lower your total taxable income, the lower the taxes will be on your benefits. The Social Security Administration will not automatically take out taxes from your monthly checks to have taxes withheld, you will need to fill out Form W-4V (Voluntary Withholding Request). Again, your tax advisor can help you determine the percentage of your benefits you should withhold.
- Retirement accounts During your working years, you may have contributed to two basic retirement accounts: an IRA and a 401(k) or similar plan (such as a 457(b) plan for state and local government employees or a 403(b) plan for educators and employees of some nonprofits). If you invested in a "traditional" IRA or 401(k) or similar plan, your contributions may have been partially or completely deductible and your earnings grew on a tax-deferred basis. But when you start taking withdrawals from your traditional IRA or 401(k), the money is considered taxable at your normal income tax rate. However, if you chose the "Roth" option (when available), your contributions were not deductible, but your earnings and withdrawals are tax-free, provided

you meet certain conditions.

• Annuities — Many investors use annuities to supplement their retirement income. An annuity is essentially a contract between you and an insurance company in which the insurer pays you an income stream for a given number of years, or for life, in exchange for the premiums you paid. You typically purchase a "qualified" annuity with pre-tax dollars, possibly within a traditional IRA or 401(k), so your premiums may be deductible, and your earnings can grow tax deferred. Once you start taking payouts, the entire amount — your contributions and earnings — are taxable at your individual tax rate. On the other hand, you purchase "non-qualified" annuities with after-tax dollars, so your premiums aren't deductible, but just like qualified annuities, your earnings grow on a tax-deferred basis. When you take payments, you won't pay taxes on the principal amounts you invested but the earnings will be taxed as ordinary income.

We've looked at some general rules governing different sources of income, but you should consult your tax professional about your specific situation. Ultimately, factors such as your goals, lifestyle and time horizon should drive the decisions you make for your retirement income. Nonetheless, you may want to look for ways to control the taxes that result from your various income pools. And the more you know about how your income is taxed, the fewer unpleasant surprises you may experience.

The BSO Pillars

Shortly after becoming sheriff, I introduced the Broward Sheriff's Office (BSO) Pillars, six initiatives designed to enhance our ability to protect and serve the community. These pillars outlined BSO's vision to establish one of the nation's most progressive, transparent and efficient public safety organizations. Most importantly, each was created with a focus to

ensure the safety of every Broward County resident. I am excited to share with you the progress we've made so far:

School Safety and Technology

BSO remains committed to prioritizing the safety of our students. Equipped with cutting-edge technology, our Real Time Crime Center (RTCC) continues identifying and investigating potential threats to our community and schools. With access to nearly 25,000 cameras in public schools, houses of worship and county facilities, the RTCC has assisted in investigating over 5,600 incidents, which led to 117 arrests. Our efforts have proven successful, and in the coming months, the RTCC will expand to include additional staff, upgraded technology and more space for partner agencies.

Also integral to school safety is BSO's robust Incident Command System (ICS) training, ensuring all personnel are ready to act if a critical incident occurs. Further, all deputies receive ongoing active assailant training to enhance their preparedness.

Serving the Broward Community

Fostering genuine relationships with our residents is vital. Initiatives such as our Park, Walk and Talk (PWT) program and the Neighborhood Support Team (NST) have facilitated great community trust. In the past year, our deputies had more than 38,000 community encounters through PWT, and NST distributed over 100,000 important public safety materials.

BSO's Department of Fire Rescue and Emergency Services also takes community education to the next level. Employing a second-to-none public education program, our dedicated team of Life Safety Educators teaches hands-only CPR and bleeding control courses, critical skills in a lifesaving emergency. They also offer free car seat installations and inspections and help educate parents and caregivers on child passenger safety.

Last year, I formed a committee to draft a comprehensive plan for BSO, leading us to a sustainable, progressive and innovative future. As we move forward, our 2024-2028 strategic plan will continue to bolster our community engagement efforts, focusing on strengthening community relationships, optimizing resource allocation and expanding the availability of online educational platforms for the public.

Training and Preparedness

In the coming months, we will open the doors to BSO's first-ever Research, Development and Training Center (RDTC), a 104,000-square-foot state-of-the-art facility. Every aspect of the RDTC will elevate our preparedness. Two 50-yard tactical firing ranges will allow for vehicle entry to replicate vehicle takedowns and active shooter scenarios, and a shoot house will be outfitted with reconfigurable panels to host a myriad of real-world training experiences. The RDTC will consolidate training efforts, enhance communication among BSO departments and foster collaboration with neighboring municipalities, ensuring seamless public safety operations throughout Broward County.

Promoting from Within

Over the past five years, we've promoted more than 1,300 employees. Our emphasis on education and leadership development courses have aided these promotions. We have also expanded academic partnerships, providing opportunities for greater professional growth. A forthcoming career track will establish employee benchmarks and provide avenues for advancement.

Recruitment

Strategic recruitment efforts have filled more than 2,000 needed positions throughout the organization. We reduced our communication center vacancy rate from 24 percent to zero. We focus our recruitment efforts on qualified individuals interested in serving the community and emphasize the inherent rewards of a public safety career. BSO is committed to innovative initiatives to continue attracting top talent.

Accountability and Transparency

BSO remains a beacon of accountability and transparency, exemplified by our actions. The men and women who work for this organization are held to the highest standards. Our Office of Inspector General, created in 2021, continues to ensure our organization runs efficiently, economically and responsibly. BSO also publishes an annual report to provide a greater understanding of how tax dollars are spent in service to protect and serve the Broward County community. BSO will continue to drive forward, focusing on these foundational pillars of success. We remain dedicated to sustainable growth and excellence in service, embodying a purpose-driven, service-oriented approach to public safety.

Balance & Aging – **Resistance Training =** Strength

Hello again fellow Wynmoor residents. At the February Health & Wellness meeting, I demonstrated a couple of easy and effective balance exercises. As I have stated in the past in articles and at the meetings, there are numerous reasons for loss of balance. Some are easier, some are more difficult, and some are very difficult to get positive results. The easiest in my opinion and experience is working on weakness. That's why my subtitle is about resistance training. Resistance training can be done with weights, machines, tubing, resistance bands and body weight. The goal is to build muscle and improve strength. Getting stronger will help improve balance and help with walking. In addition, if a person falls it can help in breaking the fall and prevent more serious injuries and can help a person get up if there is no one to help them get up.

Wynmoor has an adequate gym with lots of equipment. There are many local gyms, and you can also work out at home with just a little equipment. Never Again, Today We Bear Witness To Yes Again

The Jewish calendar has an abundance of Jewish holidays in the month of May, although they are not religious ones associated with ritual, they are significant days to remember. The first of these days is Yom Hashoah, May 6th on which we commemorate the Holocaust. The word "holocaust" is a word of Greek origin which means burnt offering. The Holocaust was the genocide of European Jewry during WWII with the Nazi army invading Poland, Denmark, France, Belgium, Austria, Czechoslovakia (then known as) The Netherlands, Italy, Greece, Romania, Norway, Luxembourg, Great Britain-The Channel Islands and The Soviet Union of which the end resulted in the murder of 6 million Jews, 2 million of them being children. There were 23 concentration camps including Bergen Belson, Dachau, Buchenwald, Warsaw, Gross-Rosen, Majdanek, Mauthausen, Ravensbrück all of which had subcamps but the most notorious camp where 1 million Jews were exterminated was Auschwitz. Not all the Jews were put to death in concentration camps. The Nazis army organized mass civilian execution squads and thousands died in prisons. It is estimated that close to 11 million people perished during the Holocaust from the brutality and torture of the Nazis and their collaborators including LGBTQ people, the mentally and physically impaired, Slavs (Croatia), ROMA (Gypsies), Jehovah Witnesses, and members of political opposition groups. Thousands of Catholic priests and Christian pastors were forced into concentration camps and were executed. Historians disagree on the actual date that the Holocaust began but it is generally an accepted fact that the day that Adolf Hitler became Chancellor of Germany on January 30, 1933 the Holocaust officially began.

When I was a little girl growing up in the 1950s, I did not know too much about this atrocity and all its effects on world Jewry. There was no such thing as Holocaust education programs in the public or private schools. There was no US Holocaust Museum in Washington DC or a Jewish Heritage Museum in New York City. The Jewish people who had lost relatives hardly spoke about the Holocaust in the 1950s because it was too painful. I remember hearing the word "refugee" for the first time when my family vacationed during the summer in the Catskill mountains because there were many Hungarian and Czechoslovakian Jewish families in the same bungalow colony. I noticed their foreign accents and tattooed numbers on their arms which I did not understand at all. I asked my parents about these tattoos and they told me a little bit but not enough for me to really understand what had taken place during World War II in Europe. My own grandparents had left the pogroms of Russia and Poland around the turn of the century and did not experience the horrors of

the concentration camps although the killings and brutal acts of violence in the pogroms was something that I remember my parents and aunts and uncles discussing because their parents had immigrated to the United States seeking religious freedom and a better life. By the time I got to high school I read The Diary of Anne Frank and afterwards in the 60s and 70s there were many more books and movies on this subject which I read and saw. One thing that I never heard uttered back in those days was holocaust denial which began to surface during the 80s and was widely promoted by Willis Carto, founder of the Institute for Historical Review, an organization that spread its false and ugly ideology both far and wide to the far right, the government of Iran and to Jew haters all over the world. After a 5-year legal battle in court where David Irving, an international renown anti Semite and Holocaust denier, sued Deborah Lipstadt, then an academic and historian from Emory University in Atlanta, Lipstadt won the case which demonstrated to the world that there was a holocaust. A few years later the documentary Denial was released in theaters everywhere and millions of moviegoers learned the truth by watching it. Today, Ambassador Lipstadt serves in the White House as Special Envoy to Monitor and Combat Anti-Semitism.

Nearly 80 years after the conclusion of WWII and the horrors of the death camps throughout Europe we remember the 6 million Jews who perished. They were innocent men, women, young and old, children and babies who did nothing except commit the crime of being Jewish and paid the ultimate price for it. It is more important than ever to observe Yom Hashoah this year in light of the massacre that took place in Israel on October 7, 2023. On that day Hamas committed a terrorist attack in which over 1200 innocent civilian lives were taken. Many likened this event to a modern-day Holocaust and called it the worst day in the State of Israel's history. There were 240 hostages taken by Hamas and as of this writing more than 6 months ago most of the hostages have not been released. There were a few women and elderly people released but the majority remain. Israel did not start this war and unequivocally has the right to defend itself. Many including Israel's allies are calling for a cease fire and the war could end tomorrow if Hamas were to release the hostages. We pray for their release and for a true everlasting peace.





This property record page is your proof of Homestead Exemption should you ever need to provide it to your mortgage or insurance company.





Safety Solutions

Target Hardening Your Jewelry at Home



It doesn't happen often. And it certainly has traveled well beyond the borders of Coconut Creek. But when it does occur, it can make you feel lost and violated.

It's when you come home and find your jewelry has been stolen.

You know you didn't leave your door unlocked because you had to use your

key to get in when you got home.

In order to commit a crime, thieves need three things: desire, a target, and an opportunity. No one can control a crook's desire to steal. But we can control, at least to some degree, whether we become a target, and we can definitely control the opportunity.

The bottom line is: while we may never be able to completely prevent a theft, we can make it harder for the bad guy to steal our stuff. In the crime prevention community, we call that "target hardening."

So how do you target harden your jewelry at home? There are several ways, ranging from free options to technology that will cost you some money.

The first thing you need to do is take inventory. Write down all your pieces of jewelry. It helps to also photograph them. That way, if anything's ever stolen, you have a picture of it to show the detective investigating your case.

The cheapest option is to hide your most expensive jewelry. Leave the cheap stuff in your jewelry box. But put the priceless items somewhere where a thief wouldn't expect. The key is that you need to remember where you hide it. If you're anything like me, I can't remember what I had for breakfast most of the time. So hiding may not be the best option for me. I'll

forget what I did with it.

The next option is to buy a safe or lock box. You could pay to have it bolted, or anchored, to the floor. This is definitely a form of target hardening in that now the thief would have to remove the bolts or anchors, walk out of your residence carrying a safe, which would be suspicious, and then find a way to get into said safe. It's a lot of extra time and work that just almost effortlessly pilfering items out of a jewelry box.

Crooks are lazy. Most of them would never be willing to do all that work. And they don't like taking too much time to do their dastardly deeds. That's why target hardening works very well in many cases.

Another option is cameras. You could install a doorbell camera, as long as your HOA or landlord allows it. These cameras are very "techie" nowadays. They'll send you an alert on your phone at the instance someone is in front of your door. A lot of them will allow you to even talk to the person as well.

You can also put a camera inside your home that points directly to your door. And we don't want you to hide it. We want whoever walks into your home to see it and know that it's there. A thief that knows his face has been captured on camera will likely be a deterred one.

Cameras target harden places, especially residential apartments, homes, and condos because the bad guys don't want to leave the cops a nice pretty picture of their faces they can use to identify them.

Most of these thieves have been arrested before so prior mugshots for comparison are always available.

Target hardening is a simple yet effective way to keep potential thieves away from your property. The harder it is to steal, the more likely you'll see the bad guys either skip your place, or give up altogether.

It's not clear where exactly the saying comes from, but there must have been a pretty good reason not to get married in one of the most beautiful months of the year!
- May isn't just a bad time to get married, though. There's the Cornish superstition that buying a new broom in May is unlucky. Oh, and apparently, you shouldn't wash any blankets either!
- May is the month that the Eurovision song contest is held every year. For those not in the know, Eurovision is an international song contest that has been held every year since 1956. Some of the contest winners over the years have gone on to be incredibly successful groups, with the most notable being ABBA!
- May is a special time for Star Wars fans worldwide and always a good reason to re-watch the movies. May the 4th is celebrated as Star Wars day, due to the way the date sounds similar to "May the Force." We won't start the debate over whether the old movies are better than the new ones, because we all know the answer to that!
- Every year there is a particular meteor shower in May called the Eta Aquariids meteor shower. Discovered in 1870, this meteor shower passes by Earth between April 19 and May 28. It's easiest to view it

- 12. Back in the day in Europe, it wasn't a good May if you didn't celebrate it with a maypole. In the UK, at least, they were present since at least 1350 AD. Celebrants would erect a long pole and attach flowers, garlands, and strips of fabric to it, around which certain dances would take place.
- 13. May is a pretty good month for US presidents. Every other month of the year, at least one US president has died, but never in May!
- 14. May is pretty exclusive when it comes to days of the week. No other month in one single year starts or finishes on the same weekday as May. Basically, if the first of May is on a Friday, and the 31st of May is on a Sunday, no other months in the year will start or end on a Friday or a Sunday!
- 15. The birthstone for May is the emerald. Emeralds are a type of stone called beryl and typically range from a deep-sea green to a lighter color. Emeralds are symbols of fertility and rebirth.
- 16. May actually has two birth flowers the Lily-of-the-Valley and the Hawthorn. The Hawthorn flower is a symbol of hope, while the Lilyof-the-Valley represents the return of happiness and sweetness.





Getting The Record Straight: Only The Facts

This is the first in a series of articles which will serve to set the record straight -- with facts and accurate information so Wynmoor's residents know what's going on in their community.

Topic #1: The "Hotwire Door Fee."

First of all, what is the "door fee?" It is a payment that all companies such as Hotwire, Comcast or AT&T, offer communities in return for granting them a contract, usually for a term of 10 years, to provide in this case, cable and internet service to Wynmoor. It is usually quoted as a specific amount of money for each unit. In this case, Hotwire was offering to pay Wynmoor a Door Fee of \$600 per unit, or approximately \$3,1 million.

It has been suggested that the "door fee" that will be paid by Hotwire has been somehow misappropriated, if not stolen from you. It is suggested that this is "your money."-which it is--and that each resident should receive approximately \$600 as a one-time payment. The Wynmoor Management Committee has been accused of "holding back" the \$3.1 million allocated to unit owners.

recommended the \$3.1 million be put into the Capital Reserve. Both the Executive Committee-the duly elected

representatives of the 18 villages--and the Council Board of Directors--the duly elected representatives of the 44 associatons---unanimously voted to accept that recommendation and direct the money to the Capital Reserve. Why did they do that? Were they wrong to do that? Was this a theft of your money? You be the judge.

Wynmoor is 50-years-old and the buildings, like people, need more maintenance, upgrades and modernization, as they age. It costs more each year to keep us in shape, to keep looking "young," and to keep us healthy. The same can be said of Wynmoor.

Where is the money needed to do this going to come from? We have a choice. We can put the one time payment from Hotwire (this is not an annual door fee, but a once in 10 year payment to be paid in three installments over two years) into the Capital Reserve, where it can be used to renovate, expand or modernize the clubhouse, the fitness center, the ballrooms, the restaurant, The Cove, the theatre, or to repair the roads or the walking path. Or \$600 can be returned to each unit owner and each unit owner would then be repeatedly assessed every time a new project was needed.

We have a Long Range Planning Committee currently What are the facts? The Management Committee developing conceptual plans for transformative changes and improvements in Wynmoor. We all want to see those changes, but they are not free. We have to find ways to pay for them.

> The members of the Management Committee, the Executive Committee, and the Council Board of Directors, all of whom are elected by the residents in Wynmoor, determined that putting the Hotwire door fee money in a reserve that would be available to pay for many of the projects envisioned for Wynmoor would make the most sense.

> The first installment, \$1.7 million, is sitting in the Capital Reserve, earning interest, ready to be spent improving this community.

> The Management Committee will recommend that the final two installments of the door fee also be placed in the Capital Reserve where it can be used for the projects we need. Is that wrong? Should we maintain a reserve from which we draw to pay for improvemnts or should we assess you whenever it's time to modernize, upgrade, enlarge, repave or repaint? What do you think?

Rack of Lamb With Rosemary Garlic Marinade



Ingredients:

1.3 lb racks of lamb

6 cloves garlic, minced

1 tablespoon fresh rosemary, chopped

1 sprig rosemary

1/4 teaspoon black pepper

1/2 teaspoon salt

4 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil 30g butter

Instructions:

Prepare the Marinade: In a small bowl, combine the minced garlic, chopped rosemary, black pepper, salt, and extra virgin olive oil. Mix well to create the marinade.

Marinate the Lamb: Place the racks of lamb in a shallow dish or a resealable plastic bag. Pour the marinade over the lamb, making sure it's evenly coated. If using a bag, seal it and massage the marinade into the lamb. Add the sprig of rosemary on top. Marinate in the refrigerator for at least 2 hours, or ideally overnight, to allow the flavors to meld.

Preheat the Oven: Preheat your oven to 200°C (400°F).

Sear the Lamb: Heat 2 tablespoons of olive oil in a large skillet over high heat. Once hot, add the racks of lamb, fat side down. Sear for 2-3 minutes until the fat is golden brown. Then, sear the meat side for another 2-3 minutes until browned. Remove from the skillet and set aside.

Roast the Lamb: Transfer the seared racks of lamb to a roasting pan or baking dish. Place them in the preheated oven and roast for 15-20 minutes for medium-rare, or until the desired level of doneness is reached. Use a meat thermometer to check for an internal temperature of 55-60°C (130-140°F) for medium-rare.

Rest and Serve: Once cooked to your liking, remove the lamb from the oven and let it rest for 5-10 minutes before slicing. This allows the juices to redistribute and ensures a tender and juicy result. While resting, add a knob of butter on top of each rack to enhance flavor.

Slice and Serve: Slice the rack of lamb between the bones into individual chops. Serve hot with salsa verde or your favorite side dishes.






